**CONSENT ORDER**

On this day, Jay Bradford, Arkansas Insurance Commissioner (“Commissioner”), and Samantha L. Floyd (“Respondent”) agree to enter into this Consent Order for the reasons stated below. From the facts and law before the Commissioner, he finds:

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. The Commissioner has jurisdiction over the parties and subject matter pursuant to Arkansas Code Annotated §23-61-103.

2. On February 15, 2011, Respondent submitted to the Arkansas Insurance Department an application for licensure as a resident insurance producer. A question on the application (specifically, question 39.1) required Respondent to state whether Respondent had ever been convicted of a crime. Respondent answered the question “no.”

3. Pursuant to Arkansas Code Annotated § 23-64-506(c), the Commissioner conducted an investigation of Respondent’s background and found that Respondent has been convicted of a crime. Respondent was issued an Arkansas Producer License, number 380710, on February 26, 2011.

**CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

4. Respondent’s criminal conviction is a violation of Arkansas Code Annotated § 23-64-512(a) (8). Respondent’s failure to provide correct information on Respondent’s resident

producer license application is a violation of Arkansas Code Annotated §§ 23-64-512(a)(1) and (3).

THE PARTIES HAVE AGREED THAT:

A. Respondent shall be allowed to retain her Arkansas Producer's License.


However, Respondent will be placed on Probation for one (1) full year of licensure.

B. Respondent understands that Respondent's conviction information will be open to the public pursuant to the Arkansas Freedom of Information Act of 1967, Arkansas Code Annotated §§ 25-19-101, et. seq.

C. Respondent understands that this Consent Order will be provided to the National Association of Insurance Commissioner and will be accessible by other states.

D. Respondent understands that this Consent Order may be used any future administrative proceedings brought against Respondent by the Commissioner.
