NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

A. Accounting Practices

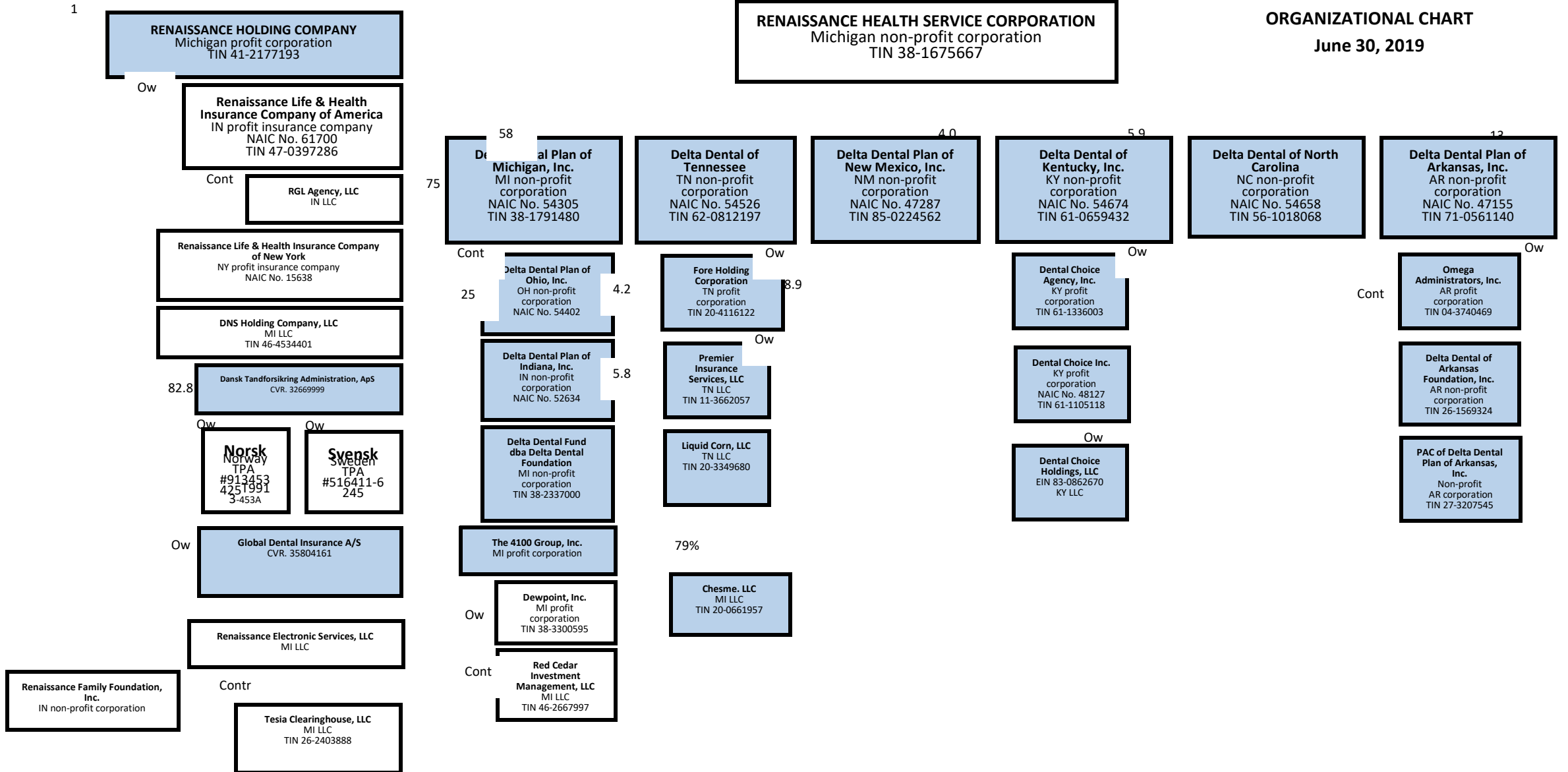
