REVOCATION ORDER

On this day, the matter of Jeremy Augusta (“Respondent”) comes before Jay Bradford, Arkansas Insurance Commissioner (“Commissioner”). The Arkansas Insurance Department (“Department”) is represented by Ava Franks, Associate Counsel, in this matter.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent holds Arkansas Nonresident Producer License No. 415851.
2. On or about February 15, 2013, the Department received an electronic complaint regarding Respondent.
3. On or about August 28, 2013, the Department Consumer Services Division mailed a written inquiry to Respondent’s address on record.
4. On or about February 18, 2014, the Department Legal Division mailed a written inquiry to Respondent’s address on record.
5. On or about March 25, 2014, the Department Legal Division mailed a second written request inquiry to Respondent’s address on record.
6. Respondent did not respond to any of Department’s written inquiries.
7. A hearing was scheduled and held June 10, 2014.
8. Respondent did not appear at the hearing.

9. The Department has evidence Respondent is actively selling insurance in Arkansas.

10. The Department has no record of any entity through which Respondent conducts the business of insurance.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

From the Findings of Fact contained herein, the Commissioner concludes as follows:

11. The Commissioner has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. §23-61-103.

12. The Commissioner may revoke a producer's license for failure to cooperate with the Commissioner in an investigation when required by the Commissioner. Ark. Code Ann. §23-64-512(a)(17).

13. An insurance producer shall not act as an agent of an insurer unless the insurance producer becomes an appointed agent of that insurer. Ark. Code Ann. §23-64-514.

14. The Commissioner may revoke a producer's license for violating a law of the Commissioner. Ark. Code Ann. §23-64-512(a)(2).


15. If it appears to the Commissioner upon sufficient grounds or evidence that any person has engaged in any act or practice constituting a violation of an insurance law, the commissioner may summarily order the person to cease and desist from the act or practice. Ark. Code Ann. §23-61-103(f)(1)(A).

RECOMMENDATION OF THE HEARING OFFICER

WHEREFORE, based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and other matters before him, the Hearing Officer recommends:

16. Respondent's Arkansas Nonresident Producer License No. 415851 should be revoked.

17. A Cease and Desist Order should be issued to Respondent ordering him to cease and desist all sales, solicitations, and negotiations of insurance products in Arkansas.


CERTIFICATION
